



Transition to and through KS5 at INA

Transition to KS5 is a big step. Our aim is to successfully support you from moving from the end of KS4 to the start of your university/post sixth form experience. We will continuously track attendance, punctuality, quality of Independent Learning completion, engagement in and out of class, adherence to the Sixth Form Code of Conduct and will feedback to your parents/carers to support you throughout the two years in achieving at the highest possible level.

During KS5 there will be key transitional stages:

1. At INA all students will serve an induction period of 6 weeks.

During the induction period we will monitor your attendance, punctuality, quality of Independent Learning completion, engagement in and out of class and adherence to the Sixth Form Code of Conduct. We will provide feedback on your performance in relation to where you will need to be performing to be successful at KS5.

Should there be concerns, we will feedback to you and your parents/carers and may place you on to a probationary period.

Should you successfully complete the induction period, you will be officially welcomed as a transitioned KS5 student.

2. A small number of students who we accept the Sixth Form will serve a probationary period.

This is for students who have had issues with attendance, punctuality, quality of Independent Learning completion, engagement in and out of class or adherence to the Code of Conduct prior to joining the Sixth Form. We will meet these students in the summer term to highlight that they would join the Sixth Form under a probationary period.

Students on probation will be monitored closely and, should they not be meeting expectations required to be a successful KS5 student we will support them in looking for an alternative path at another institution/workplace.

Students who successfully complete the probationary process will be officially welcomed as a transitioned KS5 student.

3. All Y12 students are expected to achieve in line with their target grades in their end of Y12 exams.

We know that a successful transition into Y13 learning will involve achieving at a certain level at the end of Y12. Students will be monitored closely and, should they not be meeting the grade levels required to be a successful Y13 student we will support them in looking for an alternative pathway after Y12.

We will provide regular tutorial opportunities, high quality pastoral care, support and guidance as you choose your next steps beyond KS5 and will prepare you for learning beyond KS5.
